Be Healthy Outcome Group	Quarterly	Ian Mather, SPCT	Trust Board	<p><b>The group should continue but the remit and membership should be reviewed.</b></p> <p>It should have a wider remit responsible for strategy and co-ordinating activity regarding the health and wellbeing of children and young people. The membership should be extended to reflect this wider role. One implication of widening its role would be to take on the work of other groups either removing the need for the group altogether or reducing its workload. The other groups would report into it. The group title should change to reflect its revised remit.</p>

Healthy Schools Strategic Partnership	Termly	Teresa Scragg, SMBC	No formal reporting structure	<p><b>The group should be reviewed.</b></p> <p>The function of the group is important (i.e. engaging schools on a health agenda) however different ways of achieving this need to be developed. Some of its work could be incorporated within a revised 'Be Healthy' group. Workshops/conferences have been a more effective way of engaging schools.</p>

Young People's Substance Misuse Group	Quarterly	Janice Price, SMBC	Drug & Alcohol joint commissioning grp	<p><b>The group should be reviewed.</b></p> <p>The work of the group will need to continue, i.e. coordination of implementation of plan and liaison with key agencies. Commitment to group by all agencies has been difficult to secure. Reports to Drug and Alcohol Joint Commissioning Group. Some of its work could be undertaken by the revised 'Be Healthy' group. No longer routinely reporting to the Trust Board</p>

Sexual Health Strategy and Commissioning Group	Quarterly	Ian Mather, SPCT	H&WB Board	<p><b>The group should be continued.</b></p> <p>Active group responsible for all ages; will be included in future public health/joint commissioning arrangements. Some of its work could be undertaken by the revised 'Be Healthy' group.</p>
