## Delivering the Arts Award

Langley School in Solihull pioneered the National Arts Award which teachers from Langley School/Music Service have been trained to deliver. The award allows students to gain a qualification for their involvement in the Arts.

The Arts Award supports young people to develop as artists and arts leaders and is available throughout England. The Arts Award is a nationally recognised qualification at three levels - Bronze, Silver and Gold.

Any pupil who rehearses with one of Solihull Music Service ensembles is eligible to take part in either the bronze or silver award and gain a formal accreditation.

The Arts Award also links to the new national curriculum being launched in September 2008.

As a music service we are able to deliver the Arts Award on behalf of a school. The resulting rise in confidence and motivation will not only aid the students in their own personal development, but could also have a widespread effect on the culture of the school.

## SCHOOL TAKES ITS ROCK CONCERT TO THE CAVERN, LIVERPOOL

Langley School takes its Rock Concert to the Cavern Liverpool on 1<sup>st</sup> December. Having filled Birmingham Town Hall earlier this year with a Gala Concert, the school is now appearing at the ultimate rock venue.

Along with invited schools Alderbrook, Archbishop Grimshaw, Castle Bromwich Junior and Solihull Music Service, Langley will be the first school in the country to take its Rock Concert to the Cavern. Over 100 performers and 200 parents, guests and staff will be making the trip to see two concerts on the stage where the Beatles started.

Terry Clarke, Arts Director at Langley School said:

***“When the students performed at Birmingham Town Hall they raised their level of performance way beyond our expectations. We have found that the venue can be such an inspiration. It instills self belief and self confidence so that our students always strive to be the best they can be. Performing on the most famous stage in the world should be a day to remember for all of the parents, pupils and staff making the trip to the European City of Culture 2008.”***

Solihull Music Service, which is responsible for the annual National Rock & Pop Festival at NEC, supports all of Solihull's schools with a year long programme of tuition and concerts.

As well as playing in the concerts, several students will be gaining their Arts Award, a nationally accredited scheme for rewarding leadership in the arts.
