STREET LITTER CONTROL NOTICE

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1990

SECTION 93


Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council, being satisfied that there is recurrent defacement by litter or refuse of the land highlighted green on the attached plan, being part of the street or open land adjacent to the street which is in the vicinity of the premises situated and known as King Fryer, 15 Station Road, Solihull, B91 3TG, in respect of those premises, and commencing in seven days from the date of service of this Notice, hereby require you to:

- 1) Inspect each receptacle for litter highlighted red on the attached plan once every two hours between 1800 and closing on each occasion that the premises is operational and empty the contents of each receptacle for litter that is more than half full.
- 2) Make adequate arrangements for the storage and disposal of the contents emptied from those receptacles for litter in accordance with Section 34 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.
- 3) Clear all litter from the land highlighted green on the attached plan once every two hours between 1800 and closing on each occasion that the premises is operational.
- 4) Upon closing on each occasion that the premises is operational to clear litter from the land highlighted green on the attached plan.
- 5) Display a copy of this Notice and the attached plan in a prominent position within the premises.

An appeal against this Notice may be made to a Magistrates' Court within twenty one days from the date on which it is served. The Magistrates' Court may quash, vary or add to any requirement imposed by the Notice. This Notice remains in force until repealed in writing by the Council.

If you fail without reasonable excuse to comply with the requirements on this Notice, you shall be guilty of an offence, and liable upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level four on the standard scale (currently £2,500). You may, as an alternative, be given the opportunity to discharge yourself of any liability to conviction for the offence, by payment of a fixed penalty (currently £100).
