The Metropolitan Borough of Solihull (Widney Road/Mill Lane, Bentley Heath) (Total Prohibition of Waiting) (Experimental Traffic Regulation) Order 2011

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Council have made the above mentioned Order under the provisions of Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, the Traffic Management Act 2004 and the Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Metropolitan Borough of Solihull) Order 2007, where applicable, and all other enabling powers. The Order shall come into effect on 22nd April 2011 and will remain in force on an experimental basis for a maximum period of up to 18 months. The general nature and effect of the Order will be as follows:-

Total Prohibition of Waiting

Widney Road - On both sides from a point 29 metres northwest of Mill Lane in a generally south easterly direction to a point 61 metres south east of that junction, a distance of approx' 90 metres.

Mill Lane - On its northern side from its junction with Widney Road in a generally westerly direction for a distance of approx' 46 metres.

The reasons for making this Order may be obtained by written request from the address given below; inspecting the deposited documents at Solihull Connect, located off Library Square, Touchwood, Solihull during normal opening hours or by viewing the Council's website. A copy of the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order is available from the Council upon request.

Where it appears necessary for certain operational or other purposes, the Council, or any person authorised by them may modify or suspend the Order or any of its provisions whilst the Order is in force. In due course, the Council will consider whether or not the provisions of the Experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely.

Within a period of six months from the Order coming into force, (or if any or all of the Order provisions are varied or modified by another Order, from the date of that variation or modification Order, whichever is the latest), any person may object to the making of the Order to continue on a permanent basis. Anyone wishing to make objections should apply in writing to Mr L Stevenson, Corporate Governance Division, stating the grounds on which the objection is being made by no later than 21st October 2011 at either the address given below or via email to tro@solihull.gov.uk. Any objection may be communicated to other persons who may be affected.
