Making representations on the Draft Submission Local Plan Documents Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012

Title of the Plan: Solihull Local Plan

### **Subject Matter and area covered by the Plan:**

Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council has published the Draft Submission Local Plan that it intends to submit to the Secretary of State for independent examination. The Draft Submission Local Plan will cover the whole of the administrative area of Solihull Metropolitan Borough Council and includes a wide range of planning policies. The Draft Submission Local Plan sets out a vision, objectives and spatial strategy to 2036. The Draft Submission Local Plan allocates sites that are needed to accommodate new development and areas to be protected and enhanced. The policies in the Plan will be used, alongside made Neighbourhood Plans to make decisions on planning applications. The monitoring framework sets out how the Plan will be monitored.

#### **Period for making representations:**

Representations are invited on the Draft Submission Local Plan for a period of six weeks and 2 days beginning on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> October 2020 and ending on Monday 14th December 2020 at 23:59. Representations received after this time will not be accepted. Only representations received within this period have a statutory right to be considered by the Inspector at the Examination.

In considering this, written and oral representations carry the same weight and will be given equal consideration in the examination process

## **Request for notification of Local Plan progress:**

The hard copy and online representation forms contain an option to request further notifications in relation to the progress of the Local Plan, specifically relating to the following stages:

- Submission of the Local Plan to the Secretary of State for independent examination under Section 20 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004
- Publication of the recommendations of the Planning Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State to carry out the independent examination
- Adoption of the Local Plan by the Council
- Future revisions to the Local Plan, new planning policies and guidance
