

What will happen when I go for my test?

1



Travel to the test centre on the day and at the time you have selected.

2

A member of staff will greet you on arrival and check you do not have COVID-19 symptoms.



3



Please remember to wear a face covering to your appointment unless you are exempt. One will be provided if you haven't got one. Please use the hand sanitiser on arrival.

4

You will then be escorted to the testing area where a member of staff will talk you through the test including how to register your test.



5



You will need to put the swab in the back of your mouth near your tonsils.

6

You will then need to put the swab up your nose.



7



Next carefully place the swab into the tube provided.

8

A member of staff will now process the test. You will receive your results via SMS message from NHS Test and Trace within the hour.

What is COVID-19 community testing?

Community testing is a type of COVID-19 testing for people who do not have symptoms.

It involves a swab test and gives results in under an hour. People carry out their own swab tests, then trained staff process the test.

These tests are vital in helping to stop the spread of COVID-19. They are quick and easy to do and give fast results.

Who should have the test?

Anyone living or working in Solihull over the age of 2 can get a test. This is an appointment only service, you should attend alone unless you require assistance from another adult or are aged 2-17 years old.

You must not have any symptoms of COVID-19, nor should you attend if someone in your household is self-isolating (you need to self-isolate with them).

Not everyone who tests positive for the virus gets COVID-19 symptoms. By taking the test regularly, preferably twice a week (every 3-5 days), you can make sure you are not passing the virus onto family, friends and colleagues.

How do I book a test?

Test centres and opening hours may change so please check the Council website regularly for the latest information.

Home testing kits are now available for households of school children and members of support and childcare bubbles to order direct online. From Wednesday 24 March they will be available for collection from either of the Council's community testing sites. Residents need to visit www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests for details. No booking is required for this service.

This webpage also provides a link where people can enter their postcode to find their nearest test collection site.

Help and support

Solihull residents who test positive for COVID-19 will be contacted locally by the Solihull contact tracing service with advice and support about the required self-isolation period.
