


## 52 Things to Support your Child's

### Speech and Language Skills.

#### Odd One Out!



This is a portable game and can be played with your child anywhere. The adult says three words, two of which belong to the same category and one word which is the *odd one out*, for example: '**blue, chocolate, red.**' Then ask your child which is the *odd one out*? The answer is **chocolate** because you eat it, and **blue** and **red** are colours. Make sure the answer (the *odd one out*) changes position in the list, so it is not always the first or last word.

Other examples:

**sock**

apple

pear

fruit

vegetable

**plane**

**dress**

chair

bed

cat

**green**

dog

#### Make it easier:

- Use objects/pictures that you have at home, for example, **food, clothes, toys, cutlery.**

#### Make it harder:

- Use 4/5 words - ask your child to explain which is the *odd one out* and *why?*
- Link to a topic your child is learning about at school, for example, **Pluto, Mercury, Venus, car, Earth.**
