
SPOOKY SPEAKING



 Spend some time with your child making and choosing decorations for your home ready for Halloween.

Talk about the main Halloween characters - the witches and wizards, the ghosts, the spiders, the pumpkins, the bats and cats.

Together, think of words that describe what the characters look like - its **colour**, **size** and *shape*.

Talk about the parts it has - legs, arms, eyes, broomstick, hat, wings, etc. 

Talk about what it does - builds a web, flies on a broomstick, floats around

Then think about the word itself. Can you clap out the syllables? What sound does it start with? Does it rhyme with anything?

Put some of your words together to make a sentence about each character. Say it out loud in a spooky voice. 

Make it easier: think of only one word for each character

Make it harder: use the words you have thought of to say long, spooky sentences about each character in scary voices.
