


Shirley South Ward Profile 2024



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Technical Guide to Ward Profiles

Ward profiles are part of the Solihull Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA). The JSNA is how local authorities and Integrated Care Boards assess the current and future health, care and wellbeing needs of the local community. Leading to agreed commissioning priorities that will improve the health and wellbeing outcomes and reduce inequalities.



Sub-borough data is available at a variety of levels. As well as the borough's 17 electoral wards, the majority of data is based on the standard Census geographies:

- Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) local neighbourhoods based on a minimum population of 1,000 and an average of 1,500 (134 in Solihull);
- Middle Layer Super Output Areas (MSOAs) containing an average of 7,200 persons (29 in Solihull).

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Summary

About Solihull

Solihull lies at the heart of the West Midlands motorway network, has excellent public transport connections with the Birmingham city conurbation and is linked to many overseas destinations through Birmingham International Airport.

There are 148,000 jobs located in Solihull with strengths in business services, transport and manufacturing. The borough benefits from a range of key economic assets such as Solihull town centre, the NEC complex, Jaguar Land Rover and Birmingham Business Parks.

Solihull is a largely affluent borough, characterised by above average levels of income and limited levels of poverty and deprivation. For instance:

• 73% of Solihull households own their own home compared to 62% for England and 64% for the West Midlands.

- The median annual wage of Solihull residents in full-time employment is 11% higher than the England average and 18% higher than that for the West Midlands.
- 13% of the Solihull working age population claim Universal Credit compared to 15% for England and 17% for the West Midlands.
- 14% of Solihull children aged 0-15 years live in a low income household compared to 20% for England and 27% for the West Midlands.
- The 2019 Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) shows that Solihull is the least deprived local authority in the West Midlands. Just 16% of the population live in one of the most deprived 20% of neighbourhoods in England, whereas 40% of people live in the least deprived 20%.

This is not the case for all Solihull communities and below average incomes and poverty is far more common among households in the three North Solihull wards (Smith's Wood; Kingshurst and Fordbridge; Chelmsley Wood). For instance:

- Just 47% of North Solihull households own their own home while 40% are social rented.
- 31% of the North Solihull working age population claim Universal Credit.
- 29% of North Solihull children aged 0-15 years live in a low income household.
- According to the IMD 52% of people in north Solihull live in one of the most deprived 20% of neighbourhoods in England, including 11% who live in the most deprived 5%.

About Shirley South

The Shirley South ward is located in the urban west of the Borough, bisected by the Stratford Road. Shirley is one of Solihull's commercial and economic hubs, characterised by a higher proportion of workplace jobs than resident working age population. Alongside a variety of private and public sector office based businesses, Shirley is Solihull's distribution hub (including John Lewis facilities) and with the Marshall Lake park, a significant retail centre.


Socially and economically there is a broad centre/periphery split, with prosperity levels higher in areas such as Monkspath and Blossomfield on the ward's eastern boundary. The core of Shirley South represented by Shirley Heath, Woodlands and Cranmore has a higher proportion of blue-collar families and a greater provision of socially rented housing. The map illustrates the individual localities within Shirley South, based on the Office for National Statistics LSOAs. A significant proportion of the Monkspath Central, Blossomfield South and Shirley Heath LSOAs lie within the Shirley South ward.

Population and Households

Population Size and Growth


The 2021 Census shows that 12,244 people live in Shirley South, representing 2,807 people per km² (Population density Solihull 1,213 and England 434 per km²). Shirley South has the 10th largest population density of Solihull's 17 wards.

Between 2011 and 2021 the Shirley south population increased by 165 people. This equates to growth of 1.4% over this 10-year period much lower than the Solihull (4.6%) and England (6.6%) averages. Population growth in Shirley South was the 4^{th} lowest out of Solihull's 17 wards.

Solihull Population Growth 2011 - 2021




Population Age Groups

18% of the Shirley South population are under 16 years of age (including 6.5% aged 5 and under), 57% are working age and 24% are aged 65 and over (including 4% aged 85+).

The age profile in Shirley South substantially differs from England in the size of the young adult population (POPULATION AGE 16-34 19% Shirley South vs 24% England) and the number of people age 65+ (24% Shirley South vs 18% England).


Age Structure in Shirley South




In the 10-years 2011 to 2021 population growth in Shirley South has been largely driven by those aged 0-15 and those 65 and over (+14% growth aged 0-15, +7% aged 65+). This has been partially offset by population decline among young people aged 16-24 (-19%) and by those aged 35-49 (-5%).

Comparing 10-year population growth in Shirley South and England shows significant differences in a number of age groups. The size of the under 16 population grew more strongly in Shirley South whereas growth among those aged 65+ was lower. Change among the working age population is fundamentally different with population decline in Shirley South among 16-34 year olds and those aged 35-64 years contrasting with positive growth for both of these groups at a national level.






Ethnicity

82% of the Shirley South population are white and 18% from an ethnic minority background. Shirley South's ethnic minority population is in-line with the Solihull average (18%) but slightly lower than that for England (19%). 70% of the ethnic minority population in Shirley South are Asian/Asian British, with this group representing 13% of all people in Shirley South.

Shirley South has the 9th largest ethnic minority population and 8th largest Asian/Asian British population among Solihull's 17 wards.


Ethnic Minority Population in Solihull 2021



The ethnic minority population in Shirley South is proportionally higher among younger than older age groups. For instance, 27% of those under 25 are from an ethnic minority background compared to just 5% of those aged 65+.

The pattern in Shirley South is the same as England, with the ethnic minority population higher among younger age groups in both. A sharp reduction in the ethnic minority population from the age of 50 onwards is evident in both Shirley South and England.




In the 10-years 2011 to 2021 the proportion of Shirley South residents from an ethnic minority background increased from 10% to 18% of the population.

Although the Shirley South population increased by just over 1% the number of ethnic minority residents increased by 85% (1,027 individuals) in the 10 years to 2021. This was largely offset by a fall of -8% (-875 individuals) in the number of white residents. In absolute terms the increase in Shirley South residents was largest among those from an Asian/Asian British background (+715 individuals) followed by the other ethnic group population (+144) and those from mixed or multiple ethnic groups (+130).

Growth of 85% in the ethnic minority population in Shirley South in the 10 years to 2021 is higher than the England (38%) and Solihull (+72%) averages. Growth in the ethnic minority population in Shirley South is 5th highest among Solihull's 17 wards.

Religion

69% of the Shirley South population who answered the Census religious identification question said that they had a religious faith, with 31% saying they had no religion. Shirley South has proportionally fewer people with no religion than either Solihull (35%) or England (39%).

Like Solihull and England as a whole, Christianity is the most common religious faith in Shirley South (56%).

Origin and Language


At the time of the 2021 Census, around 92% of the Shirley South population lived at the same address that they were resident in a year before. Of the remainder, most migrants lived elsewhere in the UK (93% of Shirley South migrants, 8% of Shirley South population) with a small number coming from outside UK (7% of Shirley South migrants, 0.6% of Shirley South population).

47% of the Shirley South overseas born population were born in the middle East or Asia (691 individuals), with 33% born in another European country (487 individuals), 14% (199) in Africa and 5% (74) in the Americas & Caribbean.

The Census data shows that, compared to the England average, a smaller proportion of the Shirley South overseas born population have arrived in the UK since 2014 (26% vs 34% England). By contrast, more arrived before 1981 (27% vs 14% England).

Households


There are 5,044 households in Shirley South, with family households comprising 67% (3,386) and single person households 28% (1,417). Compared with the England and Solihull averages Shirley South has fewer single person households and more family households.

Households with Dependent Children in Solihull 2021




Single parent households represent 10% of all households (485 households) in Shirley South compared to over 11% across Solihull and England.

About 53% of single parent households in Shirley South contain dependent children. The proportion of single parent households with dependent children is considerably lower than both the Solihull and England averages (5.1% of all households in Shirley South, 7.2% Solihull, 6.9% England).


Single Parent Households with Dependent Children in Solihull 2021



More households in Shirley South are occupied by older people than the benchmarks (28% of all households Shirley South, 26% Solihull, 22% England). Shirley South has a larger proportion of both older couple households and single older people households. Shirley South has 807 single older people households and at 16% of all households in the ward is the 6th highest proportion in Solihull.


Single Older People Households in Solihull 2021



Deprivation, Benefits and Poverty

For much of 2022 and 2023 UK households have been subject to high levels of inflation and a squeeze on living standards. This is reflected in local survey results, with 70% of respondents to the 2022 Place Survey saying that they were more worried about their finances than a year previously. This pattern was replicated across all three Solihull localities.

Index of Multiple Deprivation

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is the official measure of deprivation in England produced by the Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG). The IMD combines 39 economic, financial, social, environmental and housing measures into a single deprivation score for individual neighbourhoods called Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in England. There are 32,844 LSOAs in England and 134 in Solihull with an average population of 1,500.

The IMD therefore allows each LSOA neighbourhood to be ranked relative to one another according to their level of deprivation.

The 2019 IMD shows that Solihull is the least deprived upper tier Local Authority in the West Midlands and is ranked in the 2nd top quintile nationally.


Solihull is relatively polarised between large parts of the borough that rank among the least deprived areas of England and a concentration of neighbourhoods in North Solihull among the most deprived.



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Deprivation is substantially higher in the North Solihull wards of Chelmsley Wood, Kingshurst & Fordbridge and Smith's Wood than elsewhere in the borough. The deprivation evident in North Solihull is part of a wider area of disadvantage that spreads throughout east Birmingham.

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Shirley South's twelve LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 76th percentile nationally, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from the deprived Chelmsley Wood (9th percentile) to the advantaged St Alphege (94th percentile). There are few signs of substantial deprivation in Shirley South and it is one of the 25% least deprived areas in England.

Deprivation among the twelve Shirley South LSOAs ranges from the most deprived neighbourhood Woodlands on the 41st percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Monkspath Central on the 99th percentile. The majority of Shirley South LSOAs are among the least deprived 25% if neighbourhoods in England, albeit with Canmore South (42nd percentile) and Woodlands (41st percentile) being relatively deprived in context of south Solihull.


Universal Credit

As of July 2023 612, Shirley South residents were claiming Universal Credit (UC), equating to 8.5% of the working age population. The rate in Shirley South is lower than that for Solihull (12.7%) or England (14.7%).

40% of the UC in Shirley South are in employment and 60% not in employment, this is broadly in-line with the Solihull and England averages.


Universal Credit Claimant Rate in Solihull July 2023



Child Poverty

At the end of 2021/22, 221 children aged 0-15 years in Shirley South lived in a low income household. This equates to 9% of the 0-15 population, much lower than both the Solihull (15%) and England averages (20%). The rate in Shirley South is the 8th lowest among Solihull's 17 wards which range from 30% in Smith's Wood to 4% in St Alphege.

The number of children living in a low-income household in Shirley South varies between age groups. A relatively large 43% of the total are aged 5-10 years compared to just 37% of the England total.

The number of Shirley South children living in a low-income household averaged 204 in the six years 2016/17 to 2021/22. There was a substantial rise from 180 at the end of 2018/19 to 217 at the end of 2019/20 coinciding with the onset of the outbreak of covid-19. This rise is consistent with those across Solihull and England.

The number of Shirley South children living in a low income household continued to edge upwards from 2018/19 through to 2021/22.

The Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) is a component part of the IMD measuring the relative income deprivation impacting upon children aged 0-15 years.

Shirley South's twelve LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 71st percentile nationally of the IDACI, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from the deprived Smith's Wood (6th percentile) to the advantaged St Alphege (89th percentile). On this basis Shirley South would be considered one of the least 30% income deprived areas for children in England. In the Solihull context there are just five less deprived wards from a child income perspective.


There is little in the way of substantial child income deprivation among the twelve Shirley South LSOA neighbourhoods. Child income deprivation ranges from Cranmore South on the 42^{nd} percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Blossomfield South on the 98^{th} percentile. Even the most deprived neighbourhoods in Shirley South (Cranmore South; Stratford Road South-East; Woodlands) are only just inside the 50% most deprived LSOAs in England.

Older People Poverty

In February 2023 there were 256 older people in Shirley South claiming a pension credit. This equates to 9% of the pension age population, in line with the Solihull average (9%) and lower than that for England (11%). Shirley South has the 7th highest pension credit rate among Solihull's 17 wards.

The Income Deprivation Affecting Older People (IDAOP) is a component part of the IMD measuring the relative income deprivation impacting upon older people aged 65 and over.

Shirley South's twelve LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 65th percentile nationally of the IDAOP, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from Chelmsley Wood (21st percentile) to St Alphege (93rd percentile). It is notable that even the most relatively deprived Solihull wards rank outside the most deprived quintile in England on this measure. Seven Solihull wards rank as more deprived than Shirley South in terms of income deprivation affecting older people and nine less deprived.

Older people income deprivation among the twelve Shirley South LSOAs ranges from Woodlands on the 33rd percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Monkspath Central on the 93rd percentile.



Fuel Poverty

Fuel poverty is measured by the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy which determines that those households which are below the poverty line and at the same time are energy inefficient and fuel poor.

917 Shirley South households were classified as fuel poor in 2021. This equates to 11.4% of all Shirley South households, slightly lower than the Solihull (12.7%) and England (13.1%) averages. Among the 17 Solihull wards Shirley South has the 6th lowest fuel poverty rate.

Resident Economic Activity


At the time of the 2021 Census 76% of the Shirley South working age population were in employment (5,369 individuals), 3% were unemployed (236 individuals) and 21% economically inactive (1,480 individuals). Unemployment Rate in Solihull March 2021




Resident Employment


Occupation of People in Employment in Shirley South 2021


Employed in Public Services in Solihull March 2021




Claimant Count Unemployment

As of August 2023, 160 people in Shirley South were in receipt of unemployment benefit. This equates to a claimant unemployment rate of 2.2%, lower than the Solihull (3.2%) and England (3.8%) averages. Among the 17 Solihull wards the claimant unemployment rate in Shirley South is the 7th lowest.

The claimant unemployment has fluctuated over recent years following the onset on the Covid-19 pandemic in early 2020. Claimant unemployment in Shirley South has been consistently lower than England but rose from 1.5% in August 2019 to 4.3% a year later. It has subsequently trended downwards.




Resident Qualifications

Working age Shirley South residents tend to have higher levels of formal qualifications then the benchmarks. For instance, 42% of Shirley South residents (2,974 individuals) had NVQ level 4+ qualifications in March 2021 compared to 40% of the Solihull population and 37% of people in England.

Formal Qualification Levels 2021 16 - 64 Population in Shirley South






General Health of Population Shirley South 2021




Life Limited a Lot by Long – Term Health Condition Solihull Population 2021



Life Expectancy





Female Life Expectancy in Solihull 2016 to 2020




Hospital Admissions

Emergency Hospital Admissions 2016/17 to 2020/21



Standardised Admissions Ratio





Standardised Incidence Ratio





Standardised Mortality Ratio



Standardised Mortality Ratio





Households Living in a Flat in Solihull 2021





Overcrowding

Household overcrowding is assessed by comparing the number of people in a household against the number of bedrooms that they require based on the bedroom standard which determines that adults, children over 16 and children between 10 and 15 of a different sex are entitled to their own bedroom. Overcrowding occurs when the number of bedrooms in the accommodation is less than the number required under this bedroom standard.


A large majority of households in Shirley South have at least one spare bedroom and are considered under-utilised (80%, 4,038 households). This is common across Solihull and England. Just 2% of Shirley South households are overcrowded compared to the England average of 4%.

(Based on Number of Bedrooms)





Access to Car or Van

86% of Shirley South households have a car or van (4,338 households) including 45% (2,306 households) that have more than one. Car or van ownership, including multiple ownership is more common in Shirley South than the England average (76% of households including 35% multiple).




Community and Safety

Community Satisfaction and Belonging

Most Solihull respondents to the 2022 Place Survey say that they are satisfied with their local area as a place to live (84%) with just 10% saying that they are dissatisfied. Levels of satisfaction are high across all three Solihull localities and in West Solihull 88% are satisfied and 7% dissatisfied.


Satisfaction with local area as place to live


How has local area changed in last 2 years




To what extent does respondent feel they belong to local neighbourhood






Civic Participation


To what extent do feel able to influence decisions that affect your local area




Despite the fact that 57% of respondents to the 2022 Solihull Place Survey say that they can't influence






Community Safety


Feeling safe after dark in local area

Crime Deprivation

Shirley South's twelve LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 78th percentile nationally in terms of crime & disorder deprivation, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from the crime & disorder deprived Kingshurst & Fordbridge (15th percentile) to the advantaged Knowle (85th percentile). On this basis Shirley South would be considered one of the least deprived wards in terms of crime and disorder both in England and in Solihull which has fourteen more deprived wards and two less deprived wards.


Reported Crime and Antisocial Behaviour

Annual Reported Number of Crimes in Shirley South


