


Shirley West Ward Profile 2024



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Technical Guide to Ward Profiles

The JSNA is how local authorities and Integrated Care Boards assess the current and future health, care and wellbeing needs of the local community. Leading to agreed commissioning priorities that will improve the health and wellbeing outcomes and reduce inequalities.



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Summary

About Solihull

Solihull lies at the heart of the West Midlands motorway network, has excellent public transport connections with the Birmingham city conurbation and is linked to many overseas destinations through Birmingham International Airport.

There are 148,000 jobs located in Solihull with strengths in business services, transport and manufacturing. The borough benefits from a range of key economic assets such as Solihull town centre, the NEC complex, Jaguar Land Rover and Birmingham Business Parks.

Solihull is a largely affluent borough, characterised by above average levels of income and limited levels of poverty and deprivation. For instance:

• 73% of Solihull households own their own home compared to 62% for England and 64% for the West Midlands.

- The median annual wage of Solihull residents in full-time employment is 11% higher than the England average and 18% higher than that for the West Midlands.
- 13% of the Solihull working age population claim Universal Credit compared to 15% for England and 17% for the West Midlands.
- 14% of Solihull children aged 0-15 years live in a low income household compared to 20% for England and 27% for the West Midlands.
- The 2019 Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) shows that Solihull is the least deprived local authority in the West Midlands. Just 16% of the population live in one of the most deprived 20% of neighbourhoods in England, whereas 40% of people live in the least deprived 20%.

This is not the case for all Solihull communities and below average incomes and poverty is far more common among households in the three North Solihull wards (Smith's Wood; Kingshurst and Fordbridge; Chelmsley Wood). For instance:

- Just 47% of North Solihull households own their own home while 40% are social rented.
- 31% of the North Solihull working age population claim Universal Credit.
- 29% of North Solihull children aged 0-15 years live in a low income household.
- According to the IMD 52% of people in north Solihull live in one of the most deprived 20% of neighbourhoods in England, including 11% who live in the most deprived 5%.

About Shirley West


Shirley West is located in the urban west of Solihull and bordered by the Stratford Road to the east and surrounded by the Yardley Wood area of Birmingham to the north and west and Bromsgrove district to the south. Although Shirley West does not display the same extremes of prosperity and relative disadvantage evident in neighbouring Shirley East, there are neighbourhoods in Solihull Lodge and Shirley Park that are notably more deprived than the majority of suburban south Solihull. In common with the rest of Shirley, the Stratford Road is the ward's dominant feature, functioning as a transport, commercial and social hub, but also presenting some environmental, crime and anti-social behaviour challenges.

Population and Households

Population Size and Growth


The 2021 Census shows that 13,037 people live in Shirley West, representing 4,765 people per km² (Population density Solihull 1,213 and England 434 per km²). Shirley West has the 3rd largest population density of Solihull's 17 wards.

Between 2011 and 2021 the Shirley West population increased by 1,094 people. This equates to growth of 9.2% over this 10-year period much higher than the Solihull (4.6%) and England (6.6%) averages. Population growth in Shirley West was the 2nd highest out of Solihull's 17 wards.

Solihull Population Growth 2011 - 2021




Population Age Groups

19% of the Shirley West population are under 16 years of age (including 8% aged 5 and under), 61% are working age and 20% are aged 65 and over (including 3% aged 85+).

The population profile in Shirley West is closely aligned to the England average, although the young adult population is slightly smaller (22% aged 16-34 in Shirley West vs 24% England) and the 65+ group larger (20% Shirley West vs 18%).




In the 10-years 2011 to 2021 population growth in Shirley West has been driven by those aged 25-34 and those aged 50 and over (+23% growth aged 25-34, +13% growth aged 50-64, +13% aged 65+). This has been partially offset by population decline among young people aged 16-24 (-13%).

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Over the 10 years to 2021 the Shirley West population aged under 16 years grew more sharply than the England average (+16% vs +5%), whereas growth was slower among those aged 65+ (+13% vs +20%).





Ethnicity

80% of the Shirley West population are white and 20% from an ethnic minority background. Shirley West has a slightly larger ethnic minority population than either Solihull (18%) or England (19%). 69% of the ethnic minority population in Shirley West are Asian/Asian British, with this group representing 14% of all people in Shirley West.

Ethnic Minority Population in Solihull 2021


The ethnic minority population in Shirley West is proportionally higher among younger than older age groups. For instance, 28% of those under 25 are from an ethnic minority background compared to just 7% of those aged 65+.

The pattern in Shirley West is the same as England, with the ethnic minority population higher among younger age groups in both. A sharp reduction in the ethnic minority population from the age of 50 onwards is evident in both Shirley West and England.

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Ethnic Minority Population by Age Shirley West 2021




In the 10-years 2011 to 2021 the proportion of Shirley West residents from an ethnic minority background increased from 11% to 20% of the population.

Although the Shirley West population increased by just over 9% the number of ethnic minority residents increased by 89% (1,227 individuals) in the 10 years to 2021. This contrasted with a fall of - 1% (-130 individuals) in the number of white residents. In absolute terms the increase in Shirley West residents was largest among those from an Asian/Asian British background (+827 individuals) followed by the Mixed or Multiple Ethnic Group population (+172).

Growth of 89% in the ethnic minority population in Shirley West in the 10 years to 2021 is higher than the England (38%) and Solihull (72%) averages. Growth in the ethnic minority population in Shirley West is 4th highest among Solihull's 17 wards.

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Religion

65% of the Shirley West population who answered the Census religious identification question said that they had a religious faith, with 35% saying they had no religion. Shirley West has proportionally fewer people with no religion than England (39%) and is in line with the Solihull (35%) average.

Like Solihull and England as a whole, Christianity is the most common religious faith in Shirley West (51%).

Origin and Language

At the time of the 2021 Census, around 91% of the Shirley West population lived at the same address that they were resident in a year before. Of the remainder, most migrants lived elsewhere in the UK (94% of Shirley West migrants, 8% of Shirley West population) with a small number coming from outside UK (6% of Shirley West migrants, 0.5% of Shirley West population).



Proportionally Shirley West has the 9th highest overseas born population in Solihull.



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49% of the Shirley West overseas born population were born in the middle East or Asia (705 individuals), with 28% born in another European country (397 individuals), 15% (223) in Africa and 7% (97) in the Americas & Caribbean.



The Census data shows that, compared to the England average, a smaller proportion of the Shirley West overseas born population have arrived in the UK since 2014 (24% vs 34% England). By contrast, more arrived before 1981 (31% vs 14% England).


There are 5,535 households in Shirley West, with family households comprising 64% (3,531) and single person households 32% (1,763). Compared with the England and Solihull averages Shirley West has more single person households. The number of family households Shirley West has is more than the England average and less than the Solihull average.


Single parent households represent 10% of all households (568 households) in Shirley West compared to over 11% across Solihull and England.

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About 59% of single parent households in Shirley West contain dependent children. The proportion of single parent households with dependent children is slightly lower than both the Solihull and England averages (6.1% of all households in Shirley West, 7.2% Solihull, 6.9% England).

Single Parent Households with Dependent Children in Solihull 2021




More households in Shirley West are occupied by older people than the England average (25% vs 22% England), with larger numbers of both older couple households and single older people households. However, a relatively large proportion of older people households is a common feature across Solihull and Shirley West is in-line with borough.

Shirley West has 864 single older people households and at 16% of all households in the ward is the 8th highest proportion in Solihull.


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Single Older People Households in Solihull 2021



Deprivation, Benefits and Poverty

For much of 2022 and 2023 UK households have been subject to high levels of inflation and a squeeze on living standards. This is reflected in local survey results, with 70% of respondents to the 2022 Place Survey saying that they were more worried about their finances than a year previously. This pattern was replicated across all three Solihull localities.

Index of Multiple Deprivation

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is the official measure of deprivation in England produced by the Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG). The IMD combines 39 economic, financial, social, environmental and housing measures into a single deprivation score for individual neighbourhoods called Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in England. There are 32,844 LSOAs in England and 134 in Solihull with an average population of 1,500.

The IMD therefore allows each LSOA neighbourhood to be ranked relative to one another according to their level of deprivation.

The 2019 IMD shows that Solihull is the least deprived upper tier Local Authority in the West Midlands and is ranked in the 2nd top quintile nationally.

Solihull is relatively polarised between large parts of the borough that rank among the least deprived areas of England and a concentration of neighbourhoods in North Solihull among the most deprived.



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
Deprivation is substantially higher in the North Solihull wards of Chelmsley Wood, Kingshurst & Fordbridge and Smith's Wood than elsewhere in the borough. The deprivation evident in North Solihull is part of a wider area of disadvantage that spreads throughout east Birmingham.

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Shirley West's eight LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 60th percentile nationally, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from the deprived Chelmsley Wood (9th percentile) to the advantaged St Alphege (94th percentile). Although Shirley West is not significantly deprived on a national scale, it does rank as one of south Solihull's more disadvantaged areas.

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Deprivation among the eight Shirley West LSOAs ranges from the most deprived neighbourhood Solihull Lodge on the 29th percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Burman on the 81st percentile. Only two parts of Shirley West are among the most deprived 50% of LSOA neighbourhoods in England, although Shirley Lodge is one of the more deprived neighbourhoods in south Solihull.


Universal Credit

As of July 2023, 821 Shirley West residents were claiming Universal Credit (UC), equating to 10.5% of the working age population. The rate in Shirley West is lower than that for Solihull (12.7%) or England (14.7%).

46% of the UC in Shirley West are in employment and 55% not in employment. More UC claimants in Shirley West are in employment than the Solihull and England averages.



Child Poverty

At the end of 2021/22 322 children aged 0-15 years in Shirley West lived in a low income household. This equates to 13% of the 0-15 population, lower than both the Solihull (15%) and England (20%) averages. The rate in Shirley West is the 8th highest among Solihull's 17 wards which range from 30% in Smith's Wood to 4% in St Alphege.




The number of children living in a low-income household in Shirley West varies between age groups, with fewer children aged 0-5 years (25% of total) and more aged 11-15 years (41%). This split is evident nationally although it is much more pronounced in Shirley West.

The number of Shirley West children living in a low-income household averaged 302 in the six years 2016/17 to 2021/22. There was a substantial rise from 277 at the end of 2018/19 to 345 at the end of 2019/20 coinciding with the onset of the outbreak of covid-19. This rise is consistent with those across Solihull and England.

The number of Shirley West children living in a low income household edged downwards from 2018/19 to 2021/22.

The Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI) is a component part of the IMD measuring the relative income deprivation impacting upon children aged 0-15 years.

Shirley West's eight LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 56th percentile nationally of the IDACI, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from the deprived Smith's Wood (6th percentile) to the advantaged St Alphege (89th percentile). On this basis Shirley West would be considered in the middle for child income deprived areas in England. However, in Solihull it is near the bottom with only four more child income deprived wards in the borough and twelve less deprived.



Child income deprivation among the eight Shirley West LSOAs ranges from Shirley Park on the 33rd percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Burman on the 80th percentile. Although no Shirley West LSOA is subject to severe child income deprivation, three neighbourhoods are relatively deprived in a south Solihull context and in the bottom 50% in England (Shirley Park; Colebrook; Solihull Lodge).

Older People Poverty

In February 2023 there were 275 older people in Shirley West claiming a pension credit. This equates to 11% of the pension age population, higher than the Solihull average (9%) and in line with that of England (11%). Shirley West has the 5th highest pension credit rate among Solihull's 17 wards.

The Income Deprivation Affecting Older People (IDAOP) is a component part of the IMD measuring the relative income deprivation impacting upon older people aged 65 and over.

Shirley West's eight LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 53rd percentile nationally of the IDAOP, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from Chelmsley Wood (21st percentile) to St Alphege (93rd percentile). It is notable that even the most relatively deprived Solihull wards rank outside the most deprived quintile in England on this measure.

On this basis Shirley West would be considered in the middle for older people income deprived areas in England. However, in Solihull it is near the bottom with only four more older people income deprived wards in the borough and twelve less deprived.


Older people income deprivation among the eight Shirley West LSOAs ranges from Solihull Lodge on the 29th percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Peterbrook on the 66th percentile. There is a substantial gap between Solihull Lodge (29th percentile) and the next most deprived neighbourhood in Shirley West on this measure (Mill Lodge 50th percentile), showing the extent to which income deprivation affecting older people in Shirley West is concentrated in one small area.

Fuel Poverty

Fuel poverty is measured by the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy which determines that those households which are below the poverty line and at the same time are energy inefficient and fuel poor.

740 Shirley West households were classified as fuel poor in 2021. This equates to 13.1% of all Shirley West households, slightly higher than the Solihull (12.7%) average and in line with that of England (13.1%). Among the 17 Solihull wards Shirley West has the 6th highest fuel poverty rate.

Resident Economic Activity


At the time of the 2021 Census 77% of the Shirley West working age population were in employment (6,081 individuals), 4% were unemployed (301 individuals) and 20% economically inactive (1,562 individuals). Unemployment Rate in Solihull March 2021




Resident Employment

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
Occupation of People in Employment Shirley West 2021



Employed in Public Services in Solihull March 2021




Claimant Count Unemployment

As of August 2023, 220 people in Shirley West were in receipt of unemployment benefit. This equates to a claimant unemployment rate of 2.8%, lower than the Solihull (3.2%) and England (3.8%) averages. Among the 17 Solihull wards the claimant unemployment rate in Shirley West is the 7th highest.

The claimant unemployment has fluctuated over recent years following the onset on the Covid-19 pandemic in early 2020. Claimant unemployment in Shirley West has been consistently lower than England but rose from 1.7% in August 2019 to 5% a year later. It has subsequently trended downwards, albeit with a small uptick between August 2022 and 2023 (from 2.5% to 2.8%).



Resident Qualifications


Working age Shirley West residents tend to have higher levels of formal qualifications than the England average, with, for instance, 39% of Shirley West residents (3,088 individuals) qualified to NVQ level 4+ in March 2021 compared to 37% for England.

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Formal Qualification Levels 2021 16-64 Population in Shirley West








Disability in Population Shirley West 2021


Life Limited a Lot by Long – Term Health Condition Solihull Population 2021



Life Expectancy





Female Life Expectancy in Solihull 2016 to 2020





Hospital Admissions

The table below shows that rate of standardised age emergency hospital admissions in Shirley West for various health conditions relative to the England average of 100. Emergency Hospital Admissions 2016/17 to 2020/21 Standardised Admissions Ratio





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
Admissions for Alcohol 2016/17 to 2020/21


Incidence of Cancer 2015 to 2019 Standardised Incidence Ratio





Households Living in a Flat in Solihull 2021





Overcrowding


Household overcrowding is assessed by comparing the number of people in a household against the number of bedrooms that they require based on the bedroom standard which determines that adults, children over 16 and children between 10 and 15 of a different sex are entitled to their own bedroom. Overcrowding occurs when the number of bedrooms in the accommodation is less than the number required under this bedroom standard.

A large majority of households in Shirley West have at least one spare bedroom and are considered under-utilised (77%, 4,248 households). This is common across Solihull and England. Just 2% of Shirley West households are overcrowded compared to the England average of 4%.

With the exception of the three North Solihull wards bedroom overcrowding is less common among
the 17 Solihull wards than England.

Overcrowded households in Solihull 2021 (Based on Number of Bedrooms)




Access to Car or Van

84% of Shirley West households have a car or van (4,621 households) including 42% (2,344 households) that have more than one. Car or van ownership, including multiple ownership is more common in Shirley West than the England average (76% of households including 35% multiple).


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Community and Safety

Community Satisfaction and Belonging

Most Solihull respondents to the 2022 Place Survey say that they are satisfied with their local area as a place to live (84%) with just 10% saying that they are dissatisfied. Levels of satisfaction are high across all three Solihull localities and in West Solihull 88% are satisfied and 7% dissatisfied.




Satisfaction with local area as place to live






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People from a different background get on well together in local area


To what extent do feel able to influence decisions that affect your local area


Despite the fact that 57% of respondents to the 2022 Solihull Place Survey say that they can't influence local decisions only 36% say that they would definitely like more involvement with 33% saying that they definitively don't want to be involved. 


Have taken part in formal volunteering in last year


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Have taken part in informal volunteering in last year



Community Safety




Feeling safe after dark in local area

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Problem with ASB in West Solihull

Crime Deprivation

Shirley West's eight LSOAs are, on average, ranked on the 42nd percentile nationally in terms of crime & disorder deprivation, with the 17 Solihull wards ranging from the crime & disorder deprived Kingshurst & Fordbridge (15th percentile) to the advantaged Knowle (85th percentile).

Although Shirley West cannot be described as substantially crime deprived in national context, locally there is some evidence of disadvantage. Shirley West is one of the five most crime deprived wards in Solihull and in the context of neighbouring areas of south Solihull it is relatively disadvantaged.

Crime & disorder deprivation among the Shirley West's LSOAs ranges from Stratford Road North-West on the 16th percentile to the least deprived neighbourhood Burman on the 67th percentile. Stratford Road North-West is one of the most crime deprived areas in south Solihull, largely reflecting its importance as a commercial centre. Three other Shirley West LSOAs are among the most crime 40% of neighbourhoods in England (Solihull Lodge, Mill Lodge, Colebrook) forming a relatively deprived cluster in south Solihull.


Reported Crime and Antisocial Behaviour

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Annual Reported Number of Crimes in Shirley West




