The Metropolitan Borough of Solihull (Leys Lane, Meriden) (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) (Experimental Traffic Regulation) Order 2024 (Permanent Effect) Order 2025

Making of Permanent Order

The Council has now made this Order on a permanent basis under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, the Traffic Management Act 2004 and all other enabling powers. The reasons for this Order can be obtained by written request from the address below; or by inspecting the documents at Solihull Connect, The Core, Theatre Square, Touchwood, Solihull during normal opening hours or via <https://www.solihull.gov.uk/Roads-pavements-and-streetcare/Traffic-regulation-orders> A copy of the Order is available upon request. Anyone wishing to question the validity or provisions of the Order should apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date that the permanent Order became effective. The Experimental Order provisions shall continue in force indefinitely from 16 June 2025, and shall permanently maintain the following:

Prohibition of Motor Vehicles

Leys Lane, Meriden – for a short distance between its junctions with Leymere Close & Mons Avenue.

General Exemptions

Access for cyclists and pedestrians will be maintained.
