Purpose

This document has been prepared for The Head of Highway Infrastructure for a decision on the proposed installation of several raised traffic calming features on Holly Lane, Marston Green.

This report shall consider representations received to an advertised Section 90 notice as seen in Appendix B.

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The conclusions and recommendations contained herein are limited by the availability of background information and the planned use for the Site.

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CDM

The revised Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015 (CDM Regulations) came into force in April 2015 to update certain duties on all parties involved in a construction project, including those promoting the development. One of the designer's responsibilities under clause 9 (1) is to ensure that the client organisation, in this instance by provision of this document the Highway Infrastructure department, is made aware of their duties under the CDM Regulations.

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
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Background 1.

- 1.1 The HS2 Road Safety Fund allocation aims to facilitate highway improvement schemes that will contribute to a lasting road safety legacy in areas affected by or near the HS2 corridor. Holly Lane was identified as a site that would benefit from the installation of vertical traffic calming measures between its junction with Station Road and the Birmingham / Solihull administrative boundary located where Holly Lane crosses Hatchford Brook.
- The proposals consist of the installation of six (three pairs) speed cushions and a raised table junction with Chelmsley 1.2 Lane.



- The proposals as advertised are detailed in the consultation plan in Appendix A 1.2
- The proposals as advertised in the legal notice are contained in Appendix B. 1.3

Representations for Consideration 2.

- 2.1. The proposals were formally advertised on 10 October 2025 and the closing date for the receipt of representations was 31 October 2025.
- Three representations were received during the advertisement of the notices. Two respondents objected to the plans 2.2. as advertised. The other respondent raised concerns around the proposals which have been considered below.
- 2.3. The Warwickshire, Coventry and Solihull Local Access Forum were consulted and raised concerns in relation to vertical traffic calming measures across the Borough.

Officers Comments/Response

As Holly Lane is residential in nature, there are numerous existing Vehicle Access Crossings (VACs) to private driveways which restrict the available locations where speed cushions can be positioned without the need to alter existing VACs and ensuring that a consistent spacing of vertical traffic calming measures along the route is achieved.

In addition to this and in line with current guidance on traffic calming, no vertical speed measures can be constructed within 25m of a structure.

The proposals have been developed to provide a compliant design solution which will help to mitigate vehicle speeds along the route and therefore improve road safety as a result.

Officers Comments/Response

We can confirm that the bolt-down speed cushions referenced in the representation (such as those on Lugtrout Lane) are installed in accordance with current national guidance. The number and spacing of cushions on Lugtrout Lane are consistent with the requirements set out in Local Transport Note 1/07, which outlines effective spacing to mitigate vehicle speeds along a given route.

3. Other Matters for Consideration

Ward Members' Views

3.1. The Ward Members for Bickenhill & Marston Green were informed of the proposals prior to the advertising of the Notice and did not submit any objections.

Democratic Services

3.2 Democratic Services have confirmed that the notice was subject to the statutory advertisement on the dates reported and that representations were received as noted above.

Risk Implications

- 3.3 The Corporate Risk Management Approach has been complied with to identify and assess the significant risks associated with this decision/project. This includes (but is not limited to) political, legislation and reputational risks.
- 3.4 The Approach is not intended to eliminate all risks and not all the risks identified can be managed all of the time. Also, risks will still exist that have not been identified.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Council, in accordance with Section 90A of the Highways Act 1980, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police, intends to construct the following traffic calming measures at the locations specified below:

| LOCATION OF NEW SPEED CUSHIONS AND RAISED TABLE | WIDTH | HEIGHT | LENGTH |

| Speed Cushions – Holly Lane, between property numbers 67 & 69, and 78 & 80 | 1.9m | 75mm | 3m |
| Speed Cushions – Holly Lane, between property numbers 47 & 49, and 58 & 60 | 1.9m | 75mm | 3m |
| Raised Table – Raised table junction with Chelmsley Lane | 8.15m | 75mm | 21m |
| Speed Cushions – Holly Lane, between property numbers 26 & 28, and 11 & 13 | 1.9m | 75mm | 3m |
