Your Hospital Discharge Journey

Once you are medical fit to be discharged from hospital, the hospital will agree with you which discharge pathway is most suitable for your needs.

Short term services at home

Pathway 1

You will be discharged home with reablement support from the Home Discharge Service, who will assess what help you need, with support from Adult Social care and community health services. We will check on your wellbeing and provide you with an information pack. We will then talk with you (and your family or advocate) about what matters to you and any ongoing support you may need, including care costs and Direct Payments. Once a care plan is created and long-term support begins, a review will be completed to ensure care provision is appropriate.

You will leave hospital and go to a Pathway 2 bed for short-term help to become more independent, with the aim to get you home. If required, you will be allocated a social worker who will contact you to talk about what matters to you, the long-term help you need, including care costs and Direct Payments. When this short-term help ends, any long-term support will begin. For some people this may be a care home.

If your care needs mean that need long-term care direct from hospital, such as living in a care home, assessments will be completed so you can move straight to the right place for you. A social worker will be allocated and provide you with an information pack. We will visit you in hospital and talk to you (and your family or advocate) about what matters to you and plan your care together.
