The Metropolitan Borough of Solihull (Shirley Park) (Temporary Closure of Footpaths U26 and U27) (No. 5) Order 2013

The Council gives notice that it intends to make the above Order under Sections 14 and 15 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991), being satisfied that pedestrian traffic should be restricted or prohibited by reason of development site construction works that are proposed on or near to the footpath(s).

Public Footpath U26

The whole length of public footpath U26 where it runs between Haslucks Green Road to its junction with public footpath U27 in Shirley Park. The temporary closure of U26 will be required from 0001hrs on 4th July 2014 for a period of 6 months. The alternative route for pedestrians will be signed by a newly constructed permissive footpath running through Shirley Park from Haslucks Green Road to public footpath U27.

Public Footpath U27

That section of public footpath U27 where it runs from its junction with public footpath U26 in a generally south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 96 metres. The temporary closure of U27 will be required from 0001hrs on 4th July 2014 for a period of 6 months or until the works are completed, whichever is sooner. The alternative route for pedestrians will be signed via existing parks paths to Stratford Road, A34.
