Touchwood won Gold for the Retail and Wholesale Energy Reduction category for the third year running.



Solihull Town Centre heat network

The Council is undertaking a study into the feasibility of bringing affordable heating to town centre buildings through a district energy network. To further this study, a test borehole was drilled in Tudor Grange Park in January 2019 to investigate the groundwater conditions of the water-bearing rock (aquifer) beneath Tudor Grange Park as this will be the source of the networks heat.



Solihull School installed two 50kW arrays of solar panels. It is predicted that the first year of savings will be £7,000, and will reduce the sites carbon emissions.





Real Junk Food Project in partnership with Waitrose has supported a project at Hobs Moat Community Café and Food Boutique. The project was launched in May

2018. The project takes potential food waste and serves it in the café. Customers are asked for donations or to volunteer time for their meal.



Solihull Council, working with Dodd Group and Act on Energy, is starting a new project offering free gas central heating to residents who live in homes heated by inefficient electric systems.

The aim is to replace outdated electric heating with gas. This will improve energy efficiency and therefore reduce carbon emissions and the running costs for residents who are on low incomes.



Solihull Council has signed up to the Government's Emissions Reduction Pledge 2020. The

Government has set a target to reduce the public sector's emission by 30% by 2021, from 2008 levels. The Council has pledged to reduce emissions by 45% demonstrating its commitment to mitigating climate change.




Community Engagement and Education - An Engaged Borough where all members of the community, from residents, to schools and business, are encouraged and enabled to play their part in creating sustainable futures

A new car club has arrived in North Solihull offering a convenient alternative to the high cost of car ownership. Launched in December, E-Car Club (a Europear Mobility Group company) has brought 18, all- electric Renault ZOE hatchbacks to the area, which can be booked for an hour or several days at a time.




School streets is an innovative pilot scheme introduced outside three Solihull schools to help tackle traffic and promote healthy travel . In September 2018 it was announced it is to be rolled out permanently.





In November the Conservation & Historic Environment, Landscape Architecture, Urban Design & Ecology team (CLAUDE) hosted its annual Oaks and Shires event to promote our woodlands and encourage local appreciation of these valuable green spaces. This year the event was held in Alcott Wood Local Nature Reserve in Chelmsley Wood and during the weekdays attracted nearly 350 children from five local schools. On the Saturday, a free family event promoting the wonder of woodlands was held.



More than 100 fruit trees will be planted around Solihull, with hopes of producing an annual crop that local residents will be able to harvest.

The 'Free Fruit For All' project has seen Love Solihull, an environmental initiative coordinated by the council, join forces with the forestry team and Glendale - the local authority's arboriculture contractor.





The Mayor of Solihull Cllr Flo Nash officially opened a new natural play garden for the children at Our Lady of the

Wayside pre-school on Tuesday 23 October. The garden is designed give the children an organic outdoor space to explore the natural environment with a sensory wall with lots of different textures, a large wooden tepee structure, and a wildlife hide.



Love Solihull have been awarded an International
