
Using Solihull Libraries eBooks and eAudiobooks with the RBDigital app

Getting started

If you are registered for the eMagazine service, then the same username and password will give you access to the eBooks and eAudiobooks.

If you were registered but don't have the password anymore, contact <u>247library@solihull.gov.uk</u> and this can be reset for you.



Download the RBDigital app - its available for Android, Apple and Kindle Fire devices.

Unlike the previous service, it does not have to be registered with an Adobe ID, this is built in.

If you are already registered, click on the **Login** bar and go to later in these instructions.

If you need to register, click on **Register Now**.



After clicking **Register Now**, several pages will appear – first of all, choose United Kingdom from the dropdown list.

Next, choose the council providing the service.

If you type in part of "Solihull" and Solihull MBC will be suggested – click on this.

Now you can enter your details.

Enter the library card number including the SLP and all the numbers without spaces; if there is an X at the end of the number include this as well.

You can then choose a username and password. This is all you will need to log in after registering so make sure you choose something you remember.

Then enter your first name, last name, and email address.

Tick that you have read and agreed to the terms and conditions and then click **Register**.

Your account will be valid immediately so you can login to the initial page.

The RBDIgital app should stay logged in all the time on your device. If not check your device settings and whether you have the up-to-date operating system on your device.

Finding your way around and checking out

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When you login you will see 3 rows with the titles you have checked out shown.

The eMagazines do not expire, but the eBooks and eAudiobooks have their expiry date shown in a red circle at the bottom right of each title.

Read or Play is shown below each cover, you can start reading or listening from here.


The app should always save the place you have got to in the eBook or eAudiobook.


To see what titles are available to borrow or download, click on the 3 lines at the top left of the screen (ringed)

You will then get a menu where you can choose Magazines or Books, which then splits into eBooks and eAudiobooks.

You can also go into My Account and change your email/password if you wish at any point.

Your Checked Out items can also be linked to here.





All the eBooks available are shown in rows

You can search by clicking on the magnifying glass symbol.

If the book is available, **Checkout** will show below the cover.

If **Hold** shows, the eBook is out on loan, but you can place a reservation and be notified when it is available.

You can also put titles on a **Wishlist** if you want to come back to them

Click on a cover if you want more information on the title.

You can **Checkout** a book from the page above or from the detail page shown here.

On the detail page you can choose to have a shorter loan period if you think you might finish the book earlier – otherwise the book is checked out for 21 days.

You can of course now return books once read.

Once you click **Checkout**, the book is in your Checked Out items immediately.

A **Checked Out** book can be Read from the main Checked Out items screen or from the details page.

On the details page you can also **Return** a book once you have finished, or **Renew** it – there is a maximum of 21 days renewal.


Click on **Read** to view the book.

Once in the book you can jump to particular chapters or add bookmarks by clicking on the 3 horizontal lines at the top right of the screen (ringed).

You can change the look of the screen, including type size, but clicking on the cog icon at the top left (boxed)

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



The options you have for changing the screen are:

Page Layout (bottom right) – you can change the way the page transitions, the screen brightness or margins (how close the text is to the edge of the screen)

Text Settings (top left) – you can change the text size, the font/typeface used, and the spaces between lines of text. If you want larger text you may want to consider a screen magnifier.

Themes (bottom left) – you can change the background and typeface colour.






